Roger has worked in sales since 1968. His sales team sold land in Cape Coral, Florida out of their international sales office in Puerto Rico where they excelled. After his exposure in Europe, he transferred to Asia, and from Tokyo, Japan, as a base. He toured the Philippines, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Thailand and Cambodia. From there he was asked to be coordinator of counselors in the Territory of the U.S. in Guam. Before leaving Guam, he was honored by becoming elected as Exalted Ruler of the Elks Lodge #1281. The Government of Guam gave him the prestigious award of the "Ancient Order of Chamorro" and the "Ambassador at Large" for exemplary work he did for the Territory of Guam.

When arriving on Long Island, New York, the Township of Islip appointed him Commissioner of Parks Recreation and Cultural Affairs. and for years he really excelled helping the community with sports, parades, summer programs for adults and the Special Children program. During the summer months, he opened many of the schools in Islip for over 2,000 mentally and physically handicapped along the east coast through the "Special Grants" acquired from state and government agencies. He opened two new recreational centers, where he is proud to have his name being honored in the Big Bronze Plaques in these facilities.
